Melanie Vogel gave an overview of the Hyack Association history, outlining the structure of the Association, the mission, what and why the Association does what it does, the value of the City for Hyack , the value of Hyack for the City and a typical Hyack event calendar.

Ms. Vogel reviewed the Association's financial situation for 2009 and the financial challenges for 2010.

Marlene Higgins, Hyack President Elect, explained the theme and expected outcomes for 2010 which is "Be your best in the City of New West."

Everyone was invited to attend the 23rd Christmas Parade of Lights on December 5' 2009.

5. Open Delegations

Catherine Young, Canadian Diabetes Association, reported a on new partnership with Imperial Pharmacy to provide Association literature and resources as well as committed staff to assist with meter training and one-on-one consultations. Ms. Young presented a plaque of appreciation to pharmacist Ridda Bazzi who initiated the partnership between Imperial Pharmacy and the Canadian Diabetes Association.

Liz Ilczaszyn, a registered nurse with British Columbia Nurses Union, expressed concern with respect to the Fraser Health Care Authority cuts in healthcare in the community. She urged Council to talk with Fraser Health Care Authority to make known the fear that if cuts are made the beds will be lost forever.

It was noted that Council, at a previous meeting, passed a resolution to oppose the cuts being considered by the Fraser Health Care Authority.

Tony Antonias, 805 Fourth Avenue, invited everyone to attend the New Westminster Symphony and Richmond Academy of Dance program to be held at Massey Theatre on Friday, December 4, 2009 at 7:30 p.m. Admission is by donation only. Doors open at 6:30 p.m. He also announced the Winter Spectacular will be held at Massey Theatre December 16 -19, 2009.

Janis Davidson and Suzanne Lord, requested demolition of the shed at 307 Fourth Avenue. The shed is occupied by raccoons and they have become a neighbourhood nuisance, entering homes through the cat doors and other means.

Staff has been advised that the Ministry does not trap animals in urban areas. With respect to the shed, staff will provide Council with a report and offer some workable options.

Neil Powell, representing McBride Sapperton Residents' Association, raised the issue of traffic and pedestrian safety on East Eighth Avenue. He requested the removal of East Eighth Avenue, East Columbia Street, and Braid Street from the truck routes. He suggested at bare minimum, the crosswalks on East Eighth and Sherbrook should have flashing pedestrian lights and curb extensions to slow people down.

Staff noted that the areas mentioned have been identified to be removed from the truck route with the development of United Boulevard extension and the North Fraser Perimeter Road.
