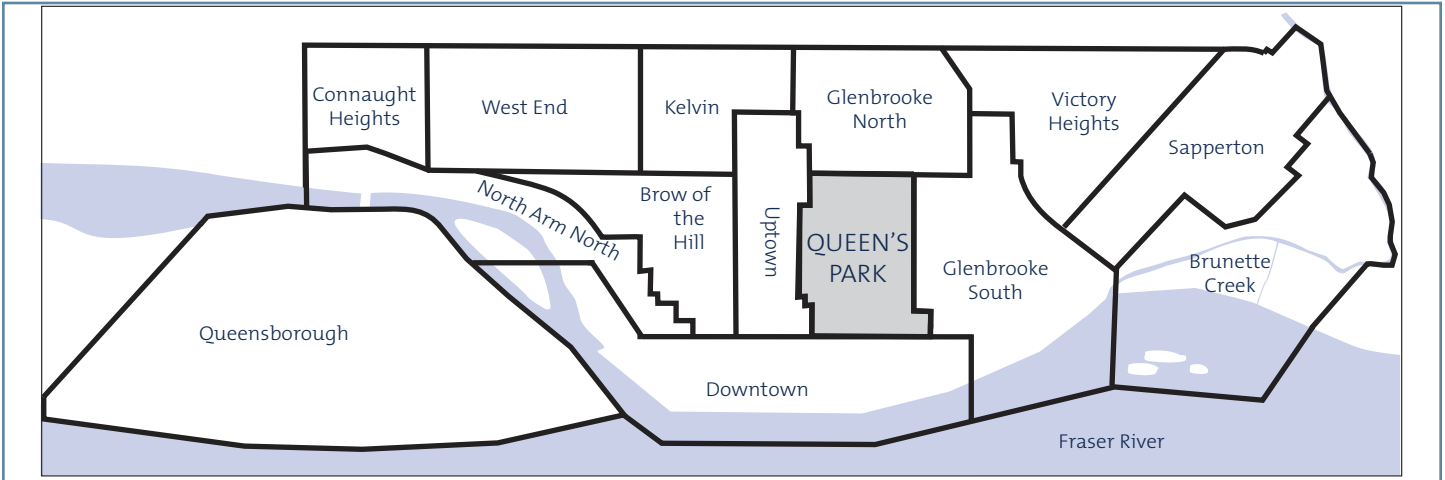

**A Note About Neighbourhood Profiles**

All data in tables, charts, and text is from Statistics Canada, based on the 2006 and 2001 Census. References in the text to “more”, “fewer”, or “similar” are all based on comparisons with Census figures for the City of New Westminster as a whole. **Distinct Neighbourhood Features**

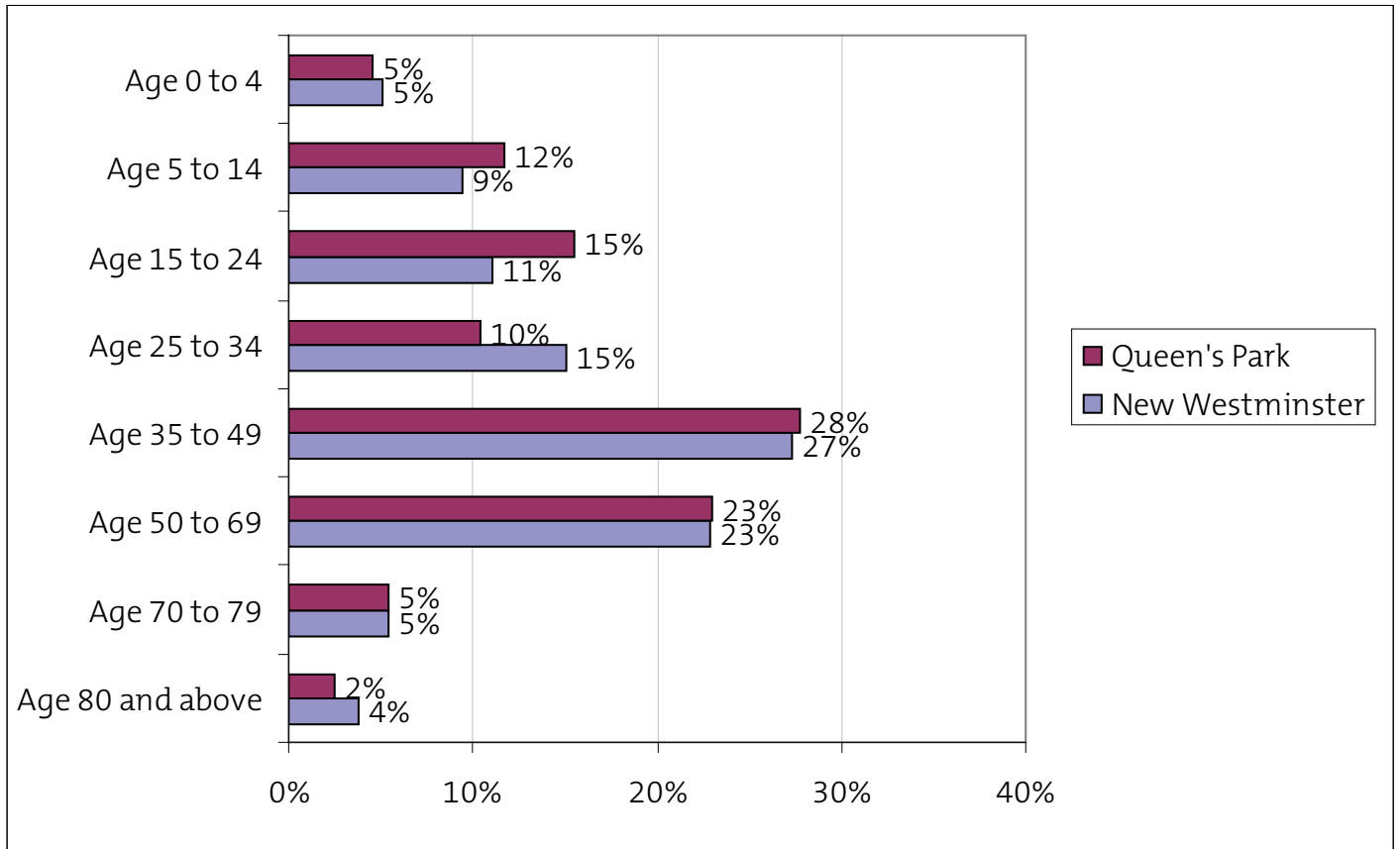
Queen’s Park is a slower growing part of the City, and saw a 7% increase in population between 2001 and 2006 based on its previous boundaries. Through the Downtown Plan process, the neighbourhood has been redefined to include apartments on the north side of Royal Avenue. When this area is counted, Queen’s Park shows growth of 21% over the same period. There are more children, youth, and young adults under 24, and fewer adults aged 25 to 34. Fewer people live alone, and there are more couples with children. Households are larger, and fewer have moved with the last five years. Median household income is much higher here than it is City-wide. Many more households live in single family homes. Renter households face more of an affordability challenge in Queen’s Park. Residents have somewhat higher educational achievement and are more likely to work in social science, education, and government. They are also more likely to work within the City, and walk, cycle, or drive to work. English is the home language of 95% of residents, and no other languages are prominent. Immigrants make up a 14% lower share of the population. The United Kingdom and United States are the most significant source countries of immigrants, and immigrants in Queen’s Park were most likely to have come to Canada before 1980.

- Total population is up 6.8% since 2001, compared with 7.5% City-wide (Based on old boundaries. In this profile Queen’s Park now includes apartments along Royal Avenue, with 355 additional residents).
- Queen’s Park makes up 5.3% of the City’s population.
- Compared to the City, Queen’s Park has 3% more persons aged 5 to 14, 4% more aged 15 to 24, and 5% fewer aged 25 to 34.

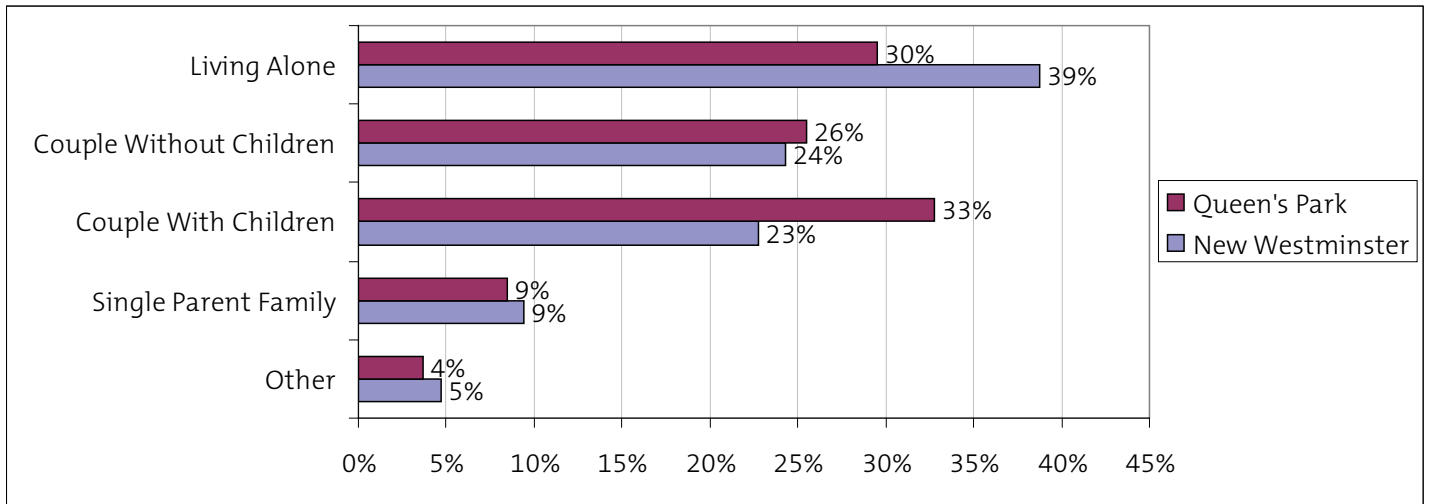

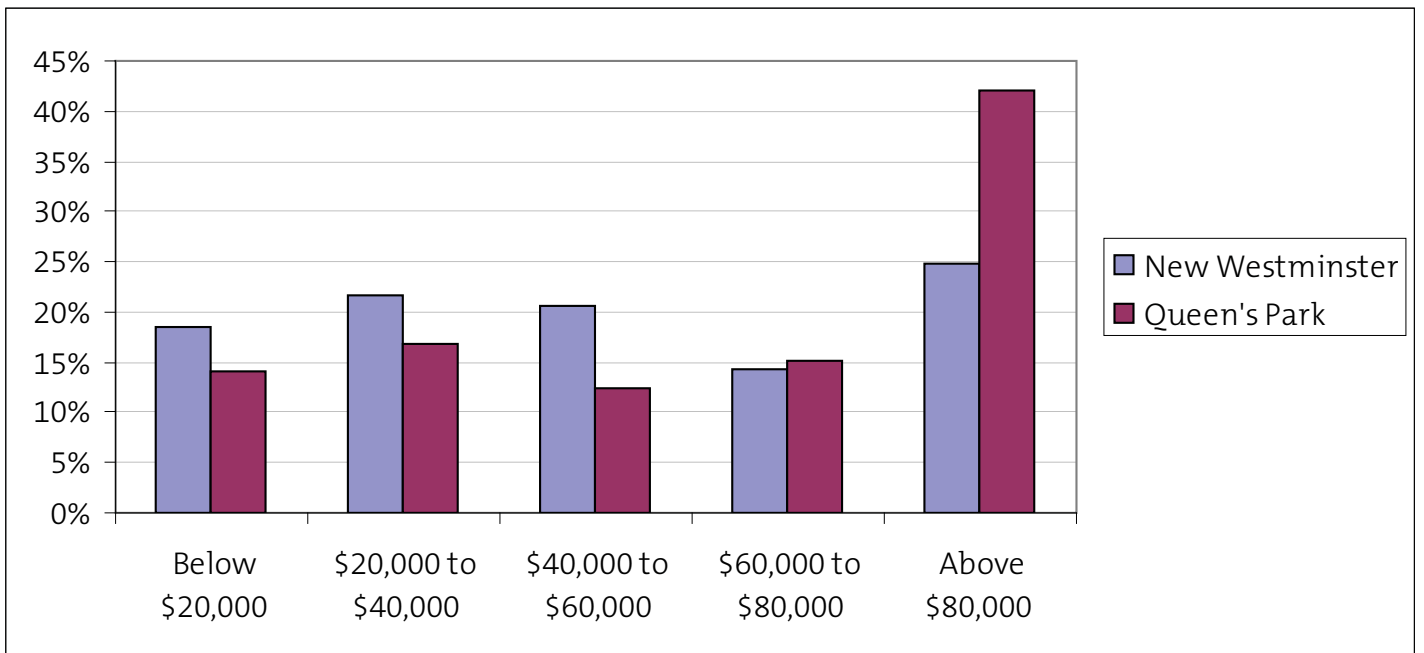

- Compared to the City, Queen's Park has 9% fewer persons living alone and 10% more couples with children.
- Average household size is 19% higher than it is City-wide.
- 9% fewer households have moved within the last 5 years.

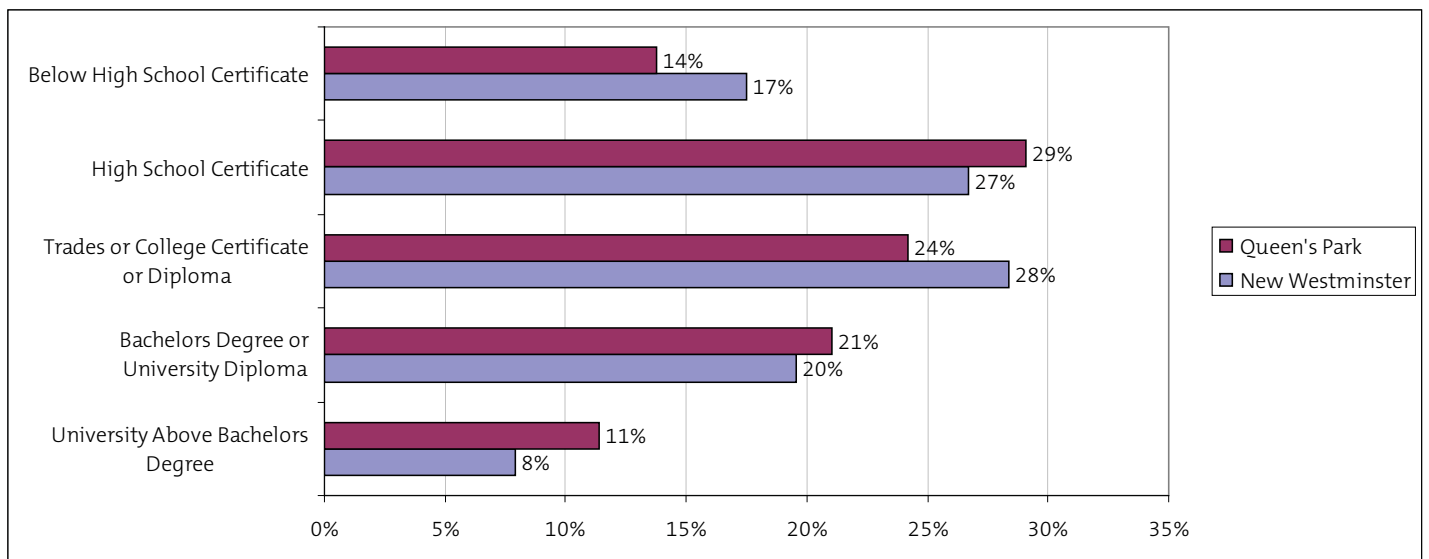
- Queen's Park has a 17% higher share in the highest income category, and an 8% lower share in the \$40,000-\$60,000 grouping.
- Its median household income is 48% higher than the City's, and it has 8% fewer low-income households.

- Queen's Park has a 35% higher share of households living in single family homes and 31% lower share of apartment households.
- 5% more renter households spend 30% or more of their income on housing.

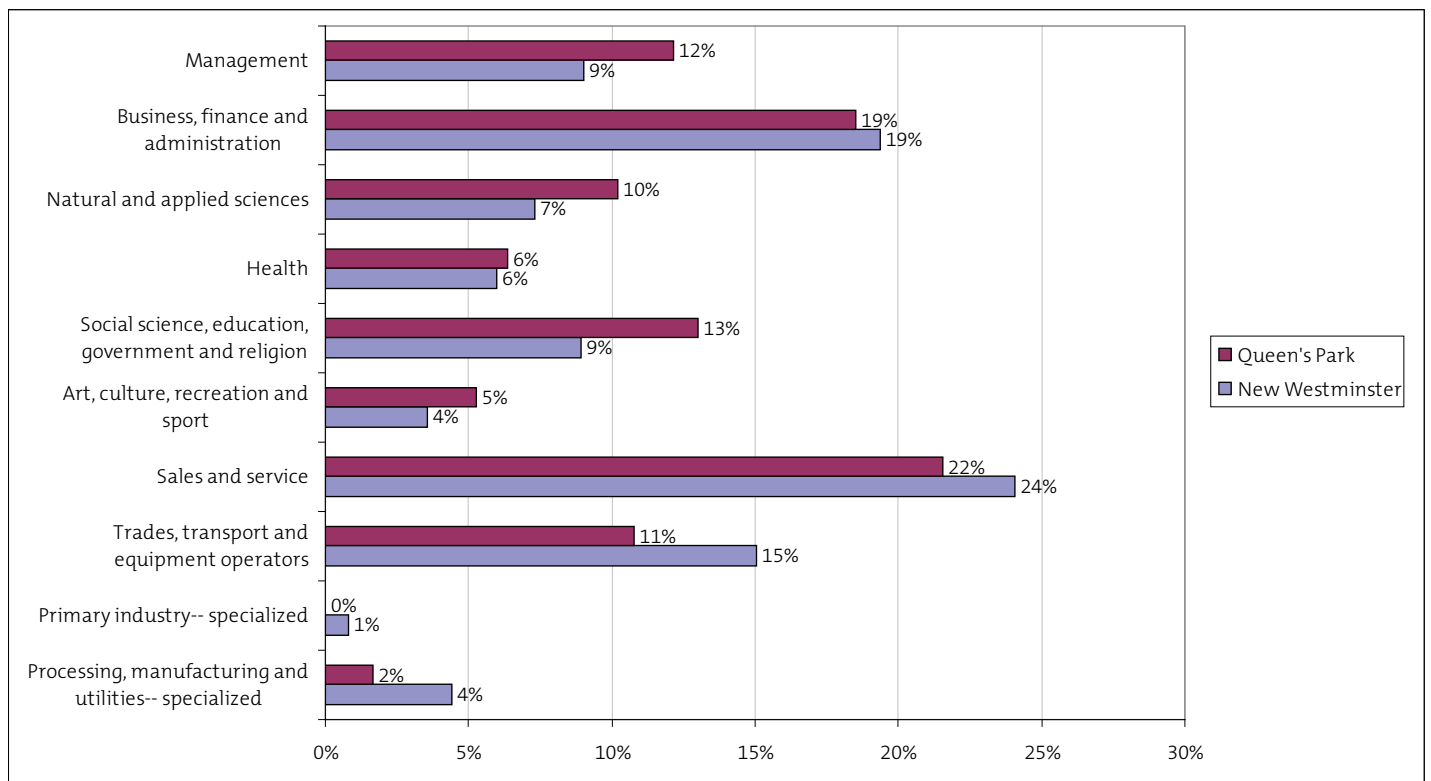
- Compared to the City, Queen's Park has slightly higher educational achievement, with 3% fewer residents with less than high-school completion, 4% fewer with a trades/college diploma, and 3% more with university beyond the Bachelors level.

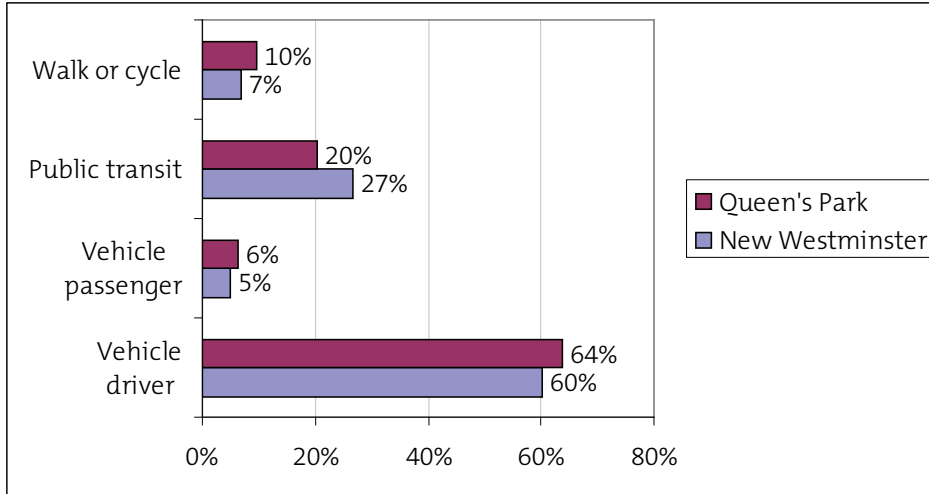

- Queen's Park has 4% more employed in social science, education and government, and 4% fewer working in trades, transport and equipment.
- 8% more residents live and work in New Westminster.

## Mode of Travel to Work



- Queen's Park residents are 7% less likely to take transit to work, and 4% more likely to drive to work.
- Transit's share of work trips is up 7% since 2001, which is the same rate as for the City (based on Queen's Park's previous boundaries the increase is 3%).

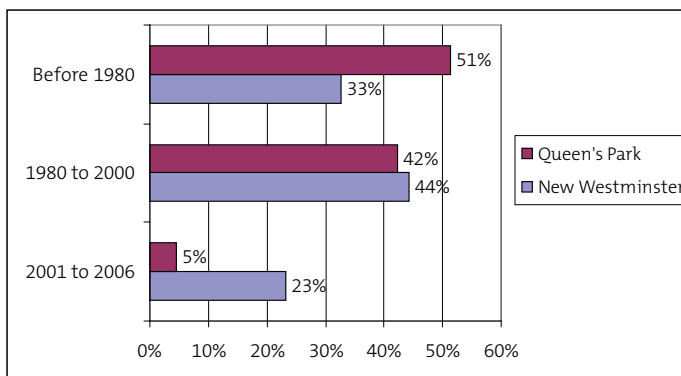
- In ethnic origin, Italian, Swedish and Polish are more prominent in Queen's Park. Chinese, East Indian and Filipino origins are significant City-wide but are not within the top ten in Queen's Park.
- Virtually all Queen's Park residents live in single-language households, and English is the home language of 95% of the population. No other single language has a significant share.
- Compared to the City, English is 16% more prevalent as a home language.

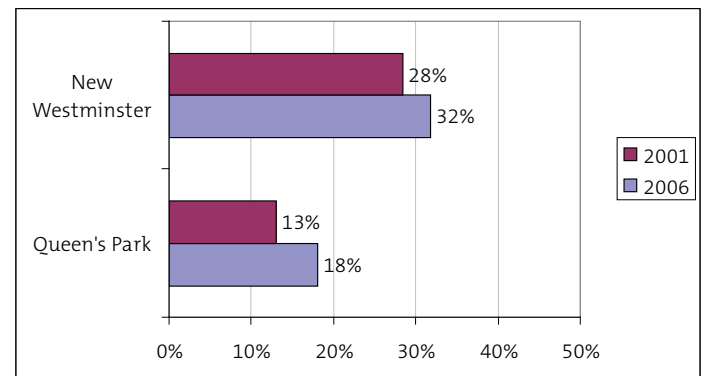

- Compared to the City, Queen's Park has a 5% higher share of Canadian citizens and 14% fewer immigrants.
- The United Kingdom and United States are much more significant source countries of immigrants.
- City-wide, recent immigrants make up 7% of the City's population. In Queen's Park, recent immigrants account for less than 1% of the neighbourhood's population.
- In Queen's Park, immigrants are much more likely to have come to Canada before 1980, and much less likely to have arrived since 2001.
- Immigrants' share of the total population is increasing both City-wide and in Queen's Park. In this neighbourhood, their share is increasing at a slightly higher rate.

### Note: How Numbers Add Up in the Census

The Census uses "random rounding" in its data, to round numbers either up or down to multiples of 5. Because of this, some figures differ slightly. For example, New Westminster population may be shown as either 57,850 or 57,845. Both totals can be considered correct and accurate.
