Director of Development Services:

5. Proposed Official Community Plan Amendment and Zoning Amendment for 210 and 259 Brunette Avenue and 232 and 234 Keary Street (OCP Designation Amendment Bylaw No. 7144, 2007 and Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 7145, 2007) (former Labatt's Site) (circulated separately)

MOVED and SECONDED

THAT the February 19, 2007, report from the Director of Development Services regarding the Proposed Official Community Plan Amendment and Zoning Amendment for 210 and 259 Brunette Avenue, 232 and 234 Keary Street and PID 025-620-606, be received for discussion.

Mayna Vancaillie, Manager, Policy Planning, presented the February 19, 2007, report from the Director of Development Services, commenting on the content of the proposed OCP and rezoning bylaws, permitted uses, that the developer has agreed to a sequencing schedule, and the subdivision issue (how density is apportioned in each of the four sub-districts). She noted that developers intend to accommodate future Fraser Health Authority needs and respond to market demands and would, therefore, like the flexibility to subdivide within the four districts. It was further noted that the applicant has advised that they may have additional time to consider the matter of subdivision and would be amenable to proceeding with the rezoning option rather than with a covenant. In this case, it would be in order to consider a motion to forward only the OCP bylaw to Public Hearing at this time.

Staff and Mr. John Conicella representing WesGroup Income Properties, responded to questions.

The Manager advised that some minor amendments have been made to the OCP Amendment Bylaw and revised copies will be circulated on table at Regular Council.

** MOVED and SECONDED and CARRIED, this Committee recommends

THAT Official Community Plan Designation Amendment Bylaw No. 7144, 2007 be forwarded to the Regular Council meeting of February 19, 2007, for consideration of first and second readings;

THAT notice be given that a Public Hearing for OCP Bylaw No. 7144, 2007 will be held on March 5, 2007; and

THAT prior to Public Hearing, OCP Bylaw No. 7144, 2007 be considered with the Corporation of the City of New Westminster 2006-2010 Financial Plan and the Greater Vancouver Regional District Liquid Waste and Solid Waste Management Plans.

2. Street Naming Convention – additional information

Members discussed the February 19, 2007, report from the Director of Engineering Services outlining potential Police Service impacts as a result of the adoption of a standardized street naming convention for 'East' designed streets, and suggesting seeking input from the public on the impact of any changes to street designations.

During discussion, it was noted that other impacts of changing street names are possible, including on residents, on realtors, on voters' lists, etc. More problems may arise as a result of making any changes

It was noted that five City streets have not been designated by bylaw. The Solicitor was present and confirmed that streets must be named by bylaw and that this omission should be addressed.

THAT this report dated February 9, 2007 entitled "Alternative Approval Process - Grimston Park", containing the basis for determination of the total number of electors for the City of New Westminster to which the approval process applies, shall be made available to the public on request.
