Section 90 (1) (e) the acquisition, disposition or expropriation of land or improvements, if the council considers that disclosure could reasonably be expected to harm the interests of the municipality;

Section 90(1) (i) *the receipt of advice that is subject to solicitor-client privilege, including communications necessary for that purpose;*

Section 90 (1) (k) *negotiations and related discussions respecting the proposed provision of a municipal service that are at their preliminary stages and that, in the view of the council, could reasonably be expected to harm the interests of the municipality if they were held in public;*

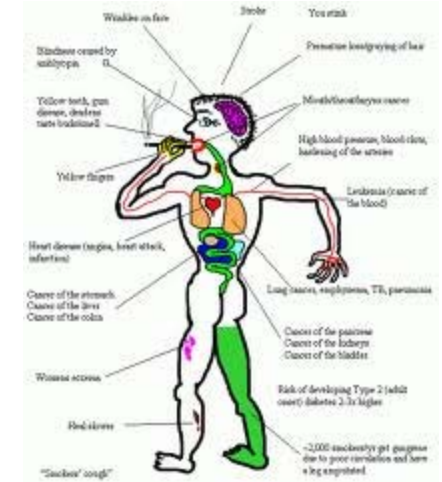
People Still Smoke

- 13.7% of Fraser Health residents aged 12+ (13.2% in New Westminster 2008-2009)
- 9.2 to 13.2 % are exposed to second hand smoke in public places



Smoking Causes Problems

- Major preventable cause of disease and death
- Affects people who smoke and those who don't
- Places large demands on personal, business and tax dollars



Second Hand Smoke

- No safe level



← 7.5 METRES →

- Causes
 - lung cancer, heart disease, stroke
 - coughing, wheezing, bronchitis, pneumonia
 - SIDS, lung and ear infections in children



Reasons to Have Municipal Smoking Control Bylaws

- Local governments deal with a wide variety of issues that influence the health and well-being of their residents
- Municipal governments are empowered to take measures above and beyond provincial legislation to better their communities
- Local governments have a track record of being leaders in healthy public policy legislation



5 Good Reasons to Strengthen the New Westminster Smoking Control Bylaw

- Protect people from second hand smoke/improve health
- Help smokers quit and keep children from starting
- Increase positive role modeling
- Reduce fire hazard and litter
- Make New Westminster a healthier community



Recommendation from Your Medical Health Officer



- Strengthen the New Westminster Smoking Control Bylaw
- Prohibit smoking in all of these areas:
 - 7.5 metres from windows, doors and air intakes
 - Restaurant and pub patios
 - Outdoor public places where people gather (such as parks, trails, beaches, play grounds, playing fields and outdoor sports venues)
