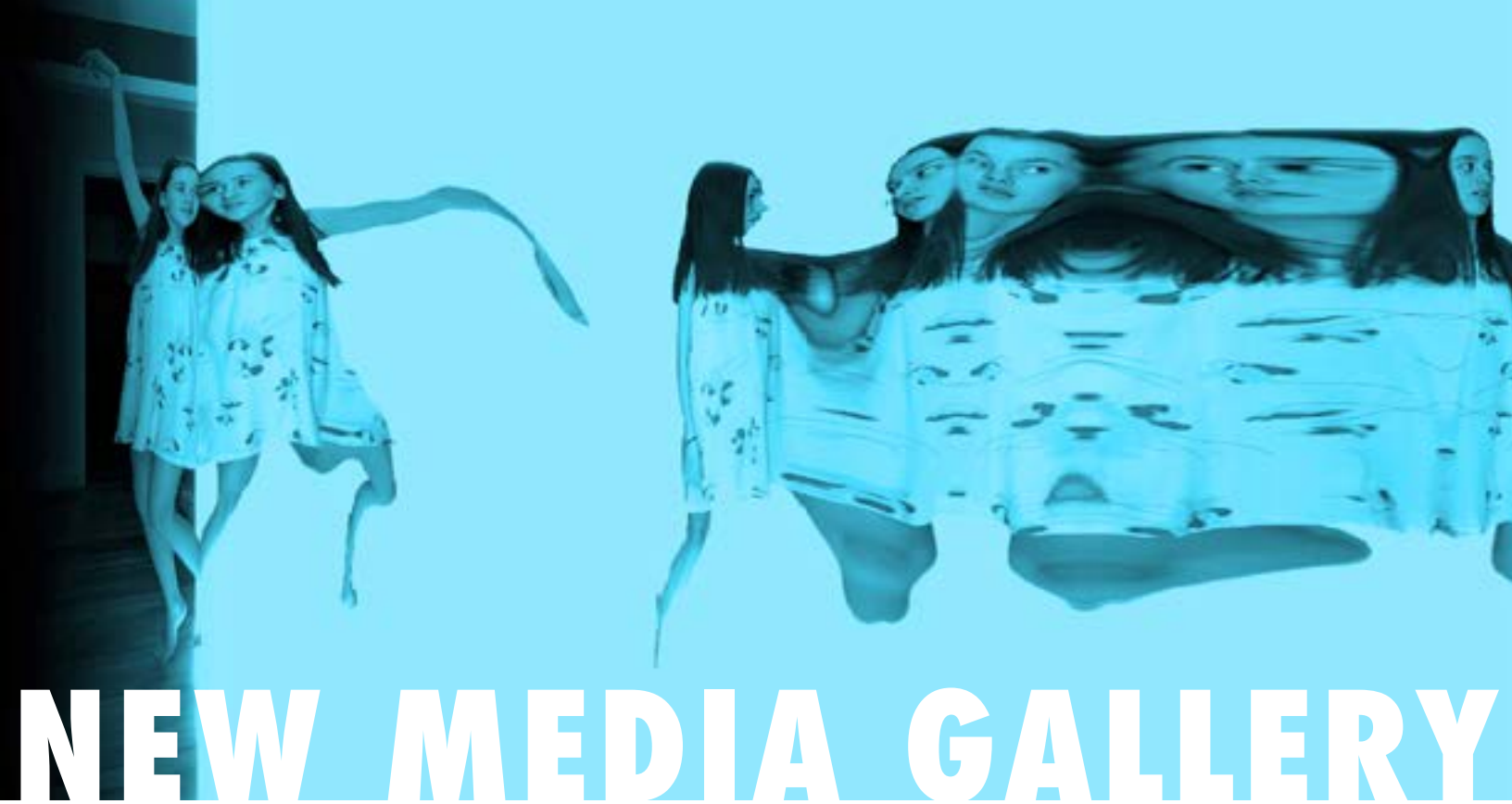

MICRO RESIDENCY

In 2020 New Media Gallery put out a call for applications from artists who needed special assistance with technology to complete their projects. We were interested in encouraging those who did not have the resources to afford expensive technology. We call these 3-Day modules; Micro-Residencies. We were overwhelmed with the response! 

