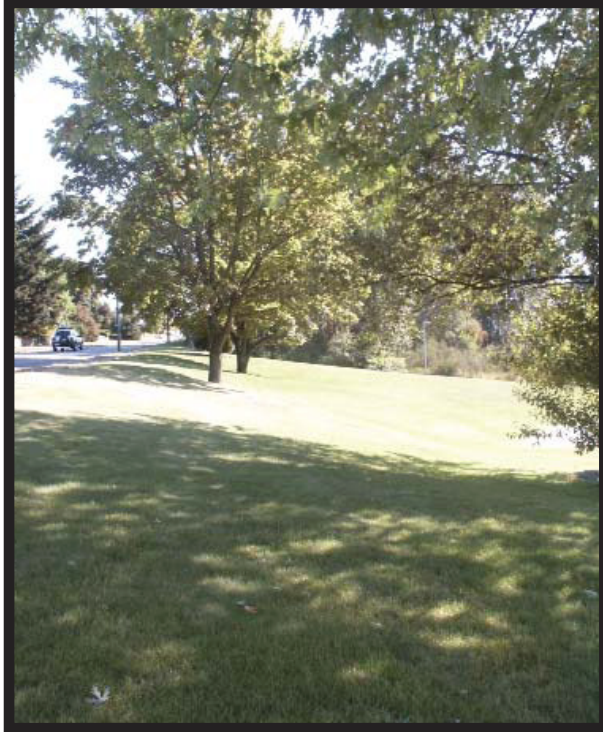


JACKSON CRESCENT TRIANGLE

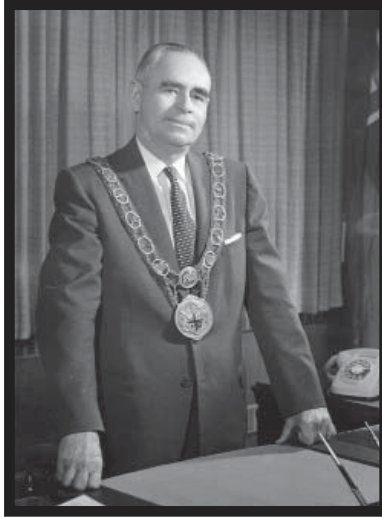


Established 1958

This small park site was created during the subdivision of Massey Heights, a new residential area developed by the city. The park was turned over to the Parks Commission, who had the triangle landscaped in 1958. Many streets in Massey Heights were named after city mayors, and some of the small park triangles adopted these names as well.

Frederick H. "Toby" Jackson

Born: December 24, 1894

Died: January 17, 1978

Toby Jackson was born in 1894 at the family's first home on Columbia Street. During World War I he served overseas with the Field Artillery. On his return home he took over the Jackson Printing Company founded by his father in 1890, and became a member of the International Typographical Union.

Jackson began his political career with his election to Council in 1937 and served as Mayor from 1950 to 1958. He served on many of the city's community boards and commissions, including the Fraser River Harbour Commission and St. Mary's Hospital.
