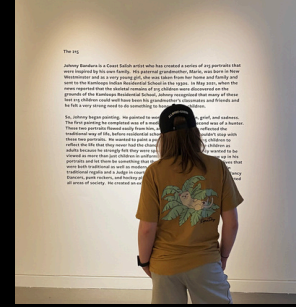

GUIDED TOURS

FIRST NATIONS, INDIGENOUS PEOPLES & COLONIZATION

This interactive program educates students on local First Nations and Indigenous peoples, as well as changes that occurred due to colonization. Students will try traditional foods, explore items from 3500 years ago, and gain an understanding of storytelling, art, residential schools, and memory.

ARTIFACTS, ARCHIVES & PEOPLE

Explore our collections, archives, and galleries at Anvil Centre. Through guiding questions, behind-the-scenes discovery, and storytelling, students will learn about how objects and records represent history, meaning, and foster connection to people and community. This program comes with an optional "classroom exhibit" edukit which can be used as a tool for teachers and students to create a display based on the identity of their unique classroom community.
