**ANSWERS TO SUBMITTED QUESTIONS**

- Q1 Is the City anticipating receipt of two proposals or one proposal that covers both projects?
- A1 The RFP is asking for one submission with each site, animal service facility and tow yard, having an independent fixed fee and matrix detailing a schedule of efforts for each.
- Q2 Item 8.2.e of the RFP says “Site preparation requirements/recommendations for the two sites including cost estimates of different options of preloading vs. removal of poor soils and lightweight fills anticipated for these sites taking into consideration the sequence of construction, budget and project schedule and potential environmental contamination due to salt water intrusion”. Considering the RFP does not cover conducting any environmental study, can you please clarify what you mean by “potential environmental contamination due to salt water intrusion”?
- A2 The City will be engaging an environmental consultant independently. The environmental consultant will take samples of soil when the geotechnical investigation occurs. The results from that testing will assist in determining the geotechnical solution.
