PART 1

RFQU PROCESS & GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1.0 GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1.1** The City of New Westminster is seeking qualified supplier(s) of caliper trees that meets the City requirements. The City may select one (1) single supplier or create a shortlist of suppliers for a period of five (5) years. Although project as outlined in this RFQU ends in 2023, the City reserves the right to continue using the qualified supplier(s) for up to five (5) years in total for all supply of caliper trees and similar product.
- 1.2** Refer to Part 2 – BUSINESS REQUIREMENTS for an in-depth scope of work.
- 1.3** The City of New Westminster is the first city in Western Canada and is located at the centre of Metro Vancouver. Just 20 km from downtown Vancouver, the City has both major transportation routes and railways running through its boundaries.
- 1.4** This is a request for Qualifications and not a call for tenders or request for binding offers. The City does not intend to enter into contractual relations as part of this RFQU process and no obligations whatsoever will arise between the City and any organization who submits a response to the RFQU (a “Respondent”) until and unless the City and a Respondent enter into a formal, written contract for the Respondent to undertake this service.
- 1.5** The City, at its discretion, reserves the right to:
- a) select a Response that deviates from the requirements of this RFQU; and/or
 - b) modify this RFQU at any time.
- 1.6** Respondents will be solely responsible for their own expenses incurred in connection with this RFQU, including in preparing and submitting a Response and in any subsequent negotiations with the City.
- 1.7** This RFQU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Province of British Columbia.
- 1.8** The City reserves the right to negotiate with the lead Respondent deemed to provide the best overall value and such negotiations may include, but are not limited to:
- a) Changes to the requirements or Scope of Work proposed by the Respondent;
 - b) Price; and
 - c) Specific contract details as deemed reasonable for negotiations by the City.
- 2.0 COVID-19 GLOBAL PANDEMIC**
- 2.1** Due to the COVID 19 global pandemic, the City may be required or decide not to proceed with the Work or to terminate any contract prior to the Work commencing. If this occurs, the City will only pay for actual costs incurred by the Respondent.
- 2.2** In submitting a Response, the Respondent acknowledges the presence of the COVID-19 virus in Canada and other jurisdictions. The Respondent also acknowledges the consequences and impacts “Known Impacts” of the COVID-19 Pandemic existing as of the date of this Request for

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Prequalification, and said “Known Impacts” have been accounted for by the Respondent within the schedule and pricing.

3.0 RESPONSE INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Responses should be submitted electronically in one (1) Adobe (PDF) file with Subject “NWRFQU-22-03 Supply of Trees” to <https://fileshare.newwestcity.ca/filedrop/~sS3M7G>

3.2 The City will receive Responses at the location and time indicated on the title page of this Request for Prequalification.

3.3 It is the Respondent's responsibility to ensure that the City receives its Response **prior to** the closing time indicated on the title page of this Request for Prequalification. The City does not accept facsimile or other unsealed Responses.

3.4 Requests for clarification or further information must be made in writing only to the individual identified on the first page of this RFQU. The City intends to respond to enquiries that it, in its sole discretion, considers relevant to this RFQU. The City intends to respond only to those relevant written enquiries received at least ninety-six (96) hours prior to the closing time. 4.0 CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

4.1 The City expects that the term of any Agreement negotiated between the City and a Respondent will be for supply and delivery of trees to any City location on an as required basis.

4.2 The City expects that the term of any Agreement negotiated between the City and a Respondent will be for an initial term of three (3) years with an additional two (2) one (1) year renewal terms at the sole discretion of the City.

5.0 OWNERSHIP OF RESPONSES AND FREEDOM OF INFORMATION

5.1 All documents submitted with your Response will become the property of the City, and as such shall be subject to the disclosure provisions of the *BC Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FOIPPA)* and *Community Charter*. A Respondent may stipulate in their Response that a portion(s) of their Response that contains confidential information and is supplied to the City in confidence. However, under FOIPPA, the City may nevertheless be obligated to disclose all or part of a Response in response to a request made under the Act, even if the Respondent has stipulated that part of their Response is supplied in confidence. The Respondent should review Section 21 and other provisions of FOIPPA in order to gain a better understanding of the City's disclosure responsibilities under the Act.

6.0 INSURANCE, PERMITS AND LICENSES

6.1 The successful Respondent will, without limiting its obligations or liabilities and at its own expense, provide and maintain throughout the Contract term, the following insurance with insurers licensed in British Columbia in forms acceptable to the City:

- a) Commercial General Liability Insurance protecting the City, for an amount of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) naming the City as additional insured;

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6.2 The successful Respondent may be required to obtain a City of New Westminster or MetroWest Inter-Municipal Business license prior to commencement of work.

7.0 LIVING WAGE EMPLOYER

7.1 Effective January 1, 2011, the City of New Westminster became a “Living Wage Employer”. As such, the City has established a [Living Wage Policy](#) that requires all firms that are contracted by the City to provide services on City premises, to pay their employees, who perform said service on City property, a Living Wage as calculated by the Living Wage for Families Campaign. The current living wage rate for Metro Vancouver is \$20.52 per hour, assuming the employer provides no benefits.

7.2 In order to determine an employee’s hourly rate with benefits the Living Wage for Families has created a Living Wage Calculator to assist with this determination. Please access the following website to determine your compatibility.

7.3 The City includes in all its competitive bid documents a Declaration referencing the City’s expectations with regards to compliance of the Policy (attached as Appendix A). **Completion and submission of the Declaration is required prior to Contract award.**

7.4 In evaluating submissions, the City intends to rely on the Declaration provided by a Respondent and shall have no obligation or duty to investigate the truthfulness of the Declaration. Please review the City’s [Living Wage Page](#) for further information.

8.0 EVALUATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

8.1 The City will evaluate all submitted valid Responses. The City will not necessarily accept any or all Responses. The object of the evaluation and selection process is to identify the Response that, in the City’s opinion offers the best value for the services requested.

8.2 The City will evaluate the requirements and only those deemed by the City to have the right experience/capabilities/methodology etc. will have their price evaluated.

8.3 Responses will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

8.4 Note that any information provided by Respondents in their Responses or discussed in presentations/ interviews may be incorporated into any Contract with the Respondent. The City reserves the right to increase or decrease the number of qualified Respondents based upon the quality and quantity of responses to this RFQU and what is deemed best value to the City.

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8.5 The City reserves the right not to review Responses where it is deemed the Respondent has a poor safety record.

8.6 The City advises all Respondents that the process for evaluation/interview and finalizing the shortlist of Respondents may take 2 – 6 weeks.

9.0 **NEGOTIATIONS**

9.1 It is the intention of the City to proceed to a second Phase for the qualified suppliers; during which the award of a contract may be subject to negotiations with the lead proponent that is deemed to provide the best value to the City. Such negotiations include, but not limited to, the following;

- a) Price; and
- b) Specific contract details as deemed reasonable for negotiations by the City.



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PART 2

BUSINESS REQUIREMENTS AND SCOPE OF WORK

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1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1** The City is looking for one (1) or more suppliers to supply and deliver caliper-sized trees to select city-owned parks and open spaces. The final number of suppliers will be based upon the ability to deliver the desired species on schedule and in the most cost effective manner.
- 1.2** The City of New Westminster has applied for the COVID-19 Resilience Infrastructure Stream (CVRIS) as part of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) specific to the funding stream for Disaster mitigation and Adaptation Infrastructure with afforestation and reforestation. The grant application submitted by the City on January 27th, 2021 proposes to plant 2,200 trees and rewild one hectare of turf grass in City of New Westminster parks and open spaces towards disaster mitigation and climate adaptation. The project is named Urban Reforestation and Biodiversity Enhancement Initiative 2021 (URBEI). The City received notice of award in July 2021 and the must be completed prior to Dec. 31, 2023. The City planted 400 of these trees in 2021 and will plant the remaining 1,600 prior to December 31, 2023. Additionally, the City will be planting a minimum of 1,000 calliper-sized trees on City boulevards 2024 through 2025.
- 1.3** URBEI is supported by the City of New Westminster's Urban Forest Management Strategy adopted in 2016 with an ambitious, yet achievable, target of 27% tree canopy cover by 2030. This target is further elevated by the City's 7 Bold Steps in response to the Climate Emergency declared by the City in 2019. Achieving this target will support the removal of 4,050 tons of carbon pollution every year and increase our forest's carbon storage capacity by 50%. To achieve 27% canopy cover in the given timeframe, the City must plant 11,800 trees (2,200 new trees on City-owned parks and open spaces, 6,300 new trees in streets, and 3,300 new trees on private land).
- 1.4** The City has retained a Project Manager (Owner's Representative) to complete the following:
- a) preliminary tree planting location mapping;
 - b) verification of each planting site; and
 - c) provision of a preliminary tree species selection based on climate change adaptability, invasiveness, and other urban forest diversity goals (as per the Urban Forest Management Strategy).
- 1.5** The project manager will also assist City staff in selecting qualified contractors, and; manage the tree supply, tree planting, and irrigation installation by contractor(s) hired by the city in parks and open spaces before Dec. 31, 2023.

2.0 BUSINESS REQUIREMENTS & SCOPE OF WORK

- 2.1** It is the objective of the City to plant up to 1,600 owner supplied new caliper-sized trees in various city-owned parks and open spaces before Dec 31, 2023.
- 2.2** All trees to meet the city's specifications.
- 2.3** Planting of these trees contributes significantly to the meeting the 27% canopy cover target outlined in the City's Urban Forest Management Strategy and Climate Action Goals.
- 2.4** All tree delivery locations to be provided on an ongoing basis, as they are determined.

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- 2.5** The process for supply and delivery of trees:
- a) City to provide desired list of species and quantities to the Contractor;
 - b) Contractor to respond with availability and suggested substitutions as applicable;
 - c) City to view available trees and select trees based upon selection criteria and quantities required;
 - d) Selected trees to be tagged (URBEI) by the Contractor;
 - e) City to notify Contractor of delivery dates and locations; and
 - f) Contractor to deliver trees to the City.

3.0 SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 3.1** Responses should be concise and directed to the requirements of this RFQU. Responses should be provided double-sided on 8 ½” white paper, in a font colour of black and not less than 11 point. All Responses must include and clearly identify:

- a) **Cover Page:** Front page of this RFQU with the required Respondent information filled out and signed.
- b) **Executive Summary:** (1 page) including a brief history of the firm, overview of overall ability and expertise, and experience and competencies in providing deliverables similar in nature to those identified for this project
- c) **Experience:** (2 Pages max) Provide an overview of your experience supplying trees in large quantities (>1,000) to municipal/commercial clients similar to the services outlined in this RFQU. Ensure you provide at minimum the following:
 - 1) Name of Client
 - 2) Number of Trees
 - 3) Budget
 - 4) Lead time given by client
 - 5) Any communications/coordination issues encountered
- d) **Methodology:** (2 pages max) To meet the City’s goal of planting 1,600 trees at various locations within the City; please provide an overview of your methodology from the start to the end on how you will support the City in this endeavour. Ensure you provide at minimum the following:
 - 1) System used to manage inventory;
 - 2) Capacity and notice required to report on available inventory;
 - 3) Steps in the ordering process from initial inquiry to tree delivery;
 - 4) Process for addressing species and/or quantity requests unavailable in existing inventory;
 - 5) Preferred method of communication with client throughout the ordering process;
 - 6) How measures of quality for digging, packaging and shipping trees are met; and
 - 7) Process for addressing errors if any should occur during the process of digging, packaging, and shipping trees to the client.

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- e) **Cost and Selection:** Refer to Appendix D for a complete costing list of desired species. Provide information for as many species and sizes on the list as possible growing in your fields (minimum of ten (10) species).

Provide the following:

- 1) **Unit Price by Volume:** Indicate cost per unit corresponding to minimum order size.
- 2) **Unit Price by Size:** Indicate cost per unit for conifer species (2 m) and for deciduous trees at three (3) caliper sizes.
- 3) **Delivery Cost and Capacity:** Indicate delivery costs (charted below) as well as an inventory of available delivery equipment and capacities.

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The City anticipates all tree-planting locations will be assessed and species selections will be completed in the spring and early summer of 2022. Deliveries will be scheduled and taken as planting operations commence in fall 2022.

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APPENDIX C

SUPPLY AND DELIVERY SPECIFICATIONS

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The following provides an overview of the expected process and will form part of the Agreement. The City will negotiate with the supplier(s) and an agreed upon final version.

Quality Control

All trees may be inspected, and hand selected by the City at the nursery supplying the trees before the trees are dug. Pre-dug or container trees procured from other suppliers will be inspected and hand selected by the City at the nursery. All trees are also subject to inspection at time of delivery. The City has the right to choose stock or reject stock in order to meet the standards in this specification.

Trees shall have a habit of growth that is normal for the species and shall be sound, healthy, vigorous and free from insects, pests, diseases, injuries and structural defects, and acclimatized to withstand outside temperatures without sustaining damage. Trees shall be appropriately branched; trunks and central main leaders shall be straight and smooth consistent with the character of the species. Trees shall be free of shipping damage. All trees of excurrent genera to have single leaders (no trees with co-dominant stems permitted).

Any material determined by the City to be unsuitable at time of delivery will remain on the Contractor's delivery vehicle and be returned at the Contractor's expense.

Container Grown Trees

All container-grown trees shall be well rooted and established in the container in which they are delivered. Soils in the container shall not contain disproportionate amounts of porous or excessively draining materials. Soils shall be well blended so that there is no concentration of any one material within the medium. The trees shall be grown in one container only and shall have sufficient fibrous roots to hold the soil together when the tree is removed from the container, but not be root-bound. Trees shall not have roots circling the trunk or have a canopy system too large for the size of container. Inspection of roots will be done at delivery site if not done at nursery. Deficiencies as listed above will be grounds for rejection.

Pruning of the scaffold branches or leader shall not be undertaken following nursery selection by the City. Only broken branches should be pruned.

Quotations should indicate where stock would be available for current viewing. Trees brought in from outside of the Lower Mainland may be considered when no other sources are available locally.

Movement of the trees shall comply with the regulations of all applicable federal, provincial and local regulations.

Alternates and/or Variations to Specifications

Except where stated otherwise herein, these specifications describe what is considered necessary to meet the performance requirements of the City. Contractors should bid in accordance with such specifications, or, if the Contractor cannot meet specifications, the Contractor may offer an alternative that they believe to be the equivalent. Contractors are to clearly indicate any variances from the City's specifications or conditions in their Quotation. The City is not obligated to accept any alternatives. The City will determine what constitutes an allowable variation.

Guarantee Period

All trees to be warranted for a minimum period of twelve (12) months from the invoice date and shall be alive and in satisfactory growth for each specific kind of tree, as determined by the City. Any tree, prior to the one-year period, showing no signs of growth, shall be replaced at the next available planting season (Spring or Fall) upon notification from the City.

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The guarantee does not include vandalism, storm damage, animal damage, improper planting, abnormal weather conditions, or mechanical damage unrelated to nursery practices; nor does it include defects resulting from lack of adequate maintenance, neglect, or abuse by the City. Replacement plant material is subject to all requirements stated herein, and cost of replacement plant material shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

Availability

The City understands that availability of each tree species may be limited by demand from other contracts. In the event a particular species sells out, the City will work with the Contractor(s) on choosing alternative species that are available or may choose to work with an alternative contractor for obtaining specific species of trees. Should the City and the Contractor agree upon alternative species when the original species is unavailable, those alternative trees will be provided at the same cost as the tree being replaced.

Delivery

Contractors will be required to deliver quantities as so ordered. The City will work with the Contractor(s) on delivery dates. All deliveries will be co-ordinated through the City's Parks Department.

The Contractor shall protect trees during delivery to prevent damage to the root ball, trunk, and branches. Flat-branched trees shall be protected during transport by tying in the branches. Trees shall be thoroughly protected from the possibility of chain marks, girdling or other shipping damage, any of which may render a tree unsuitable. All plants shall be handled by the root ball or container only.
