As a key member of the leaderships team, this position reports to the Director of Engineering and is responsible for the planning and implementation of excellent transportation infrastructure and programming. The portfolio includes planning and delivery of an ambitious sustainable transportation program in response to the City's Strategic Plan and Climate Action Bold Steps; parking policy and parking management; planning and implementation of road safety and neighborhood traffic calming improvements, and; traffic management including administration of Street Occupancy Permits.

Managing and leading staff in the implementation of transportation initiatives, the incumbent is responsible for conducting planning, technical analysis and design; planning and supporting implementation of capital projects and operational improvements; road safety reviews and the planning, design and implementation of improvements. This position requires extensive contact within the community and with various internal and external stakeholder; excellent communication skill is critical in this role.
