7. Streets for People Update

Lisa Leblanc, Manager of Transportation, provided a verbal update that highlighted:

- Working with HUB and Happy City to engage with the community, monitor the program, make observations and provide feedback
- 6th Street in Uptown infrastructure and lane reallocation adjustments being planned
- Challenges with Quayside Esplanade

In response to a question from a member of the task force, Antonia Reynolds, Coordinator, Active Transportation, advised that HUB and the Walker's Caucus assisted with supplying volunteers to support the activation, engagement and monitoring components of the Streets for People program, as outlined in the report to Council August 31.

In response to a question from staff, Lisa Leblanc advised that monitoring includes observations on-site, and data collection using video cameras at intersections, which is analyzed for data on vehicle volume, number of cyclists and pedestrians traveling through the intersection.

Discussion ensued on:

- Next steps for the Streets for People program and ways to continue the program once analysis has been completed and staff have a picture of the successes and challenges
- Clarifications on potential traffic, parking and public transit implications on 6th and 8th streets, and then implementation of some changes
- Conflicts between cyclists and pedestrians on Quayside Esplanade and options for clarified signage and public education on sharing the space.
